CERTIFICATE IN RECONCILIATION STUDIES PROGRAM

8 Months - 18 Credit Hr Hybrid Online & Land Based Learning Stand-alone or complete as part of a Peace & Justice masters degree

The St. Stephen's University Centre for Reconciliation Studies offers an accredited Certificate Program dedicated to equipping individuals, organizations, churches and community leaders for thoughtful, respectful and effective engagement with Indigenous communities.

This 18-credit-hour program addresses the lack of quality preparation for reconciling relationships endemic in Canadian society (and beyond).

Initiated by the Chair of our Board of Governors, Judith Moses, a member of the Delaware people from Six Nations of the Grand River, and designed in conjunction with Indigenous faculty, neighbours and friends, the program is designed to prepare people to commit to an ongoing process of reconciliation, as invited by the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's 94 Calls to Action.



Spiritual Care

prepares students for multi-faith pastoral and spiritual care in a variety of chaplaincy settings. Study can be completed as an add-on to a master's degree at SSU (not included in the total credit hours of a student's degree program) or as a stand-alone credential without a program.





INCLUSIVE SPIRITUALITY & INTERRELIGIOUS HOSPITALITY

Through (1) online recorded lectures and live Zoom conferences, (2) reading and written reflection, and (3) engagement with their teachers and cohort, students gain understanding and skills for multifaith chaplaincy and the art of inclusive spiritual care across traditions. The goal is to prepare spiritual caregivers who are sensitive to and welcoming of the Other.

Represented faiths include Judaism, Christianity, Islam, Hinduism, Buddhism, Sikhism, Wicca, First Nations spirituality and the "Nones and Dones" (Unaffiliated / Agnostic / Atheist).
